WHAT IS FAFSA?

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is a form that can be prepared annually by current and prospective students to determine their eligibility for student financial aid.

PELL GRANT

PELL - The Federal Pell Grant Program provides need-based grants for students to assist with tuition, books and other school related costs. A student's eligibility is determined by a standard formula computed by the U.S. Department of Education. Federal PELL Grant Awards are based on family size, income assets and by actual number of clock hours attended at studentaid.gov. *The Pioneer Tech code is 011206.*

FEDERAL SUPPLEMENTAL EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY GRANT (FSEOG)

The FSEOG is a grant for undergraduate students with exceptional financial need. FSEOG - To establish eligibility, the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) must be completed to determine the student's financial need.

COMMUNITY HEALTH FOUNDATION

This Kay County organization sponsors scholarships to PN students twice a year. The Foundation's mission is to improve the health of the citizens of Kay County through programming, education, scholarships, partnerships, and grants.

OKLAHOMA TUITION AID GRANT (OTAG)

Students must be a legal
Oklahoma resident
and will be asked
to complete a form
verifying their domicile.
They must

also present an unexpired state ID,

usually a drivers license. Students must maintain satisfactory progress (SAP) in their program of study to receive OTAG.



WORKFORCE INVESTMENT ACT

This program provides job training and employment opportunities for economically disadvantaged, unemployed and under employed people. Scholarship Opportunities

13TH YEAR WAIVER

Complete the PTC training program started as a high school student by obtaining one of the school's 13th Year Tuition Waivers. Available on a limited basis to high school graduates within the PTC district. No deadline to apply.

PTC FOUNDATION

In 1998, a group of Kay county individuals dedicated to helping PTC students formed a foundation to provide scholarships. These scholarships vary in amounts and are awarded by the executive board of the foundation in December.

FIRST TIME STUDENT TUITION WAIVER

In May 2002, the Pioneer Technology Center Board of Education made another commitment to the residents of District #13. Qualifying graduates in PTC's district have the opportunity to attend school tuition free. Students may take advantage of this opportunity until the age of 21...no deadline to apply.

OTHA GRIMES/FRANCIS TUTTLE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is available to adult students enrolled in a program at a Career and Technology Center. Applicants must submit applications to their Financial Aid Administrator.
